Dear Parent / Guardian,

We hope you are all keeping well. It has been a busy term for Transition Year students and we would like to congratulate them on their work. Attached is an outline of the workshops/activities/guest speakers that the students have had the opportunity of engaging in or will engage in up to the Christmas holidays. All information on these events is relayed to the students through their *TY Year Group Team*. We encourage you to discuss this *Team* and check the portfolio where students write an evaluation of each activity.

As you are aware our students will be having their scheduled *Assessment Zone 1* examinations starting on Monday 16th December. TY students have formal exams in Irish, English and Maths. They have ongoing assessments in their other subjects and will receive a report on VSware after Christmas. They will receive a credit, result, and comment for each subject that they have completed since September. It is very important that students are keeping up to date with all their work in all their subject areas, completing tasks on a nightly basis and meeting their deadlines. Students are responsible for inputting information and reflections on their educational experiences in the TY programme. This is facilitated during their weekly ePortfolio class and can be completed at home also. Within each student's ePortfolio, there are sections on academic work, educational and cultural visits, guest speakers and workshops, work experience, extra-curricular, and reflections to be completed by each student on a weekly basis.

Please be mindful that the second work experience placement will take place from February 4th – 14th 2025. It is vital that each student has secured their placement before they return to school after the Christmas holidays on 6th January 2025.
